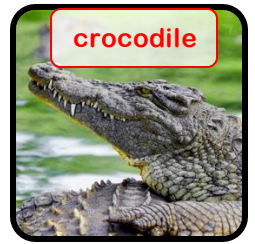

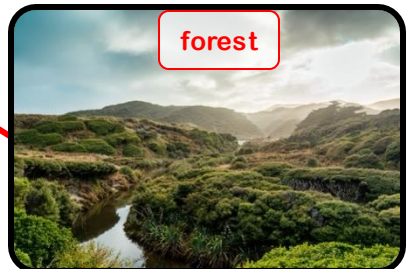

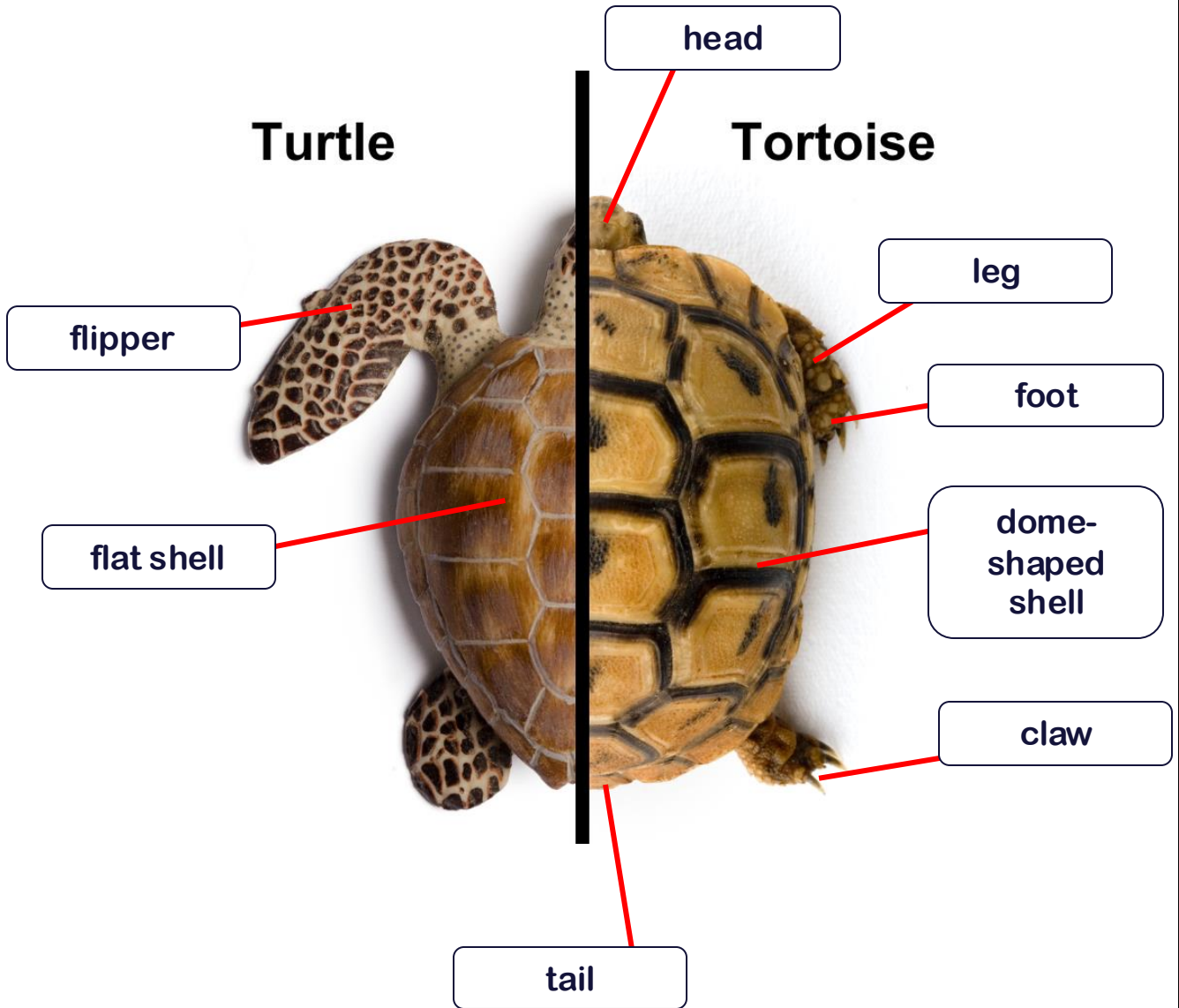

2. What does each snake eat?



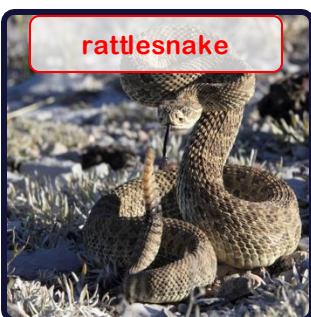
1. Forests, grasslands and deserts (North America)
